Vacation Bible School has come and gone. It was a great week: This year's theme was "Journey off the Map". Each night our students and helpers learned how to walk by Faith with Jesus as our Guide. (Isaiah 30:21)

During the month of July our challenge as a church will be to examine our faith. May we pray to the Lord to increase our faith. Let us exhort one another to walk by faith.

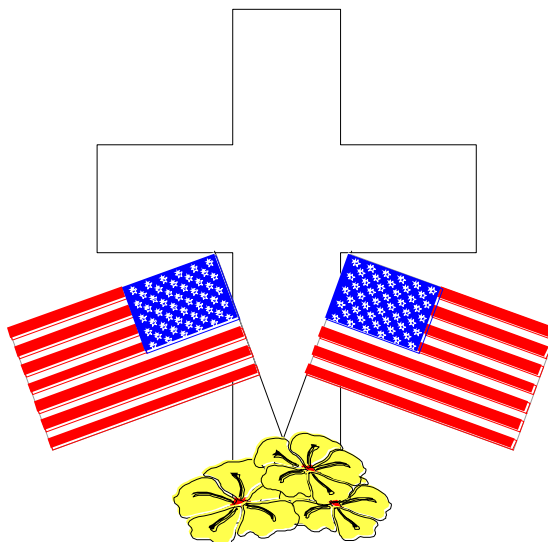
HELP THE BROTHERHOOD AND YOUTH HELP THE SALEMBURG CHRISTIAN FOOD BANK

NEWS FROM OUR WMU DIRECTOR

July is a busy time for many reasons, including school is out, it is vacation time for many families during the holiday week, kids are involved in summer activities, as well as other obligations. This can make it hard to be involved with mission activities or events.

This does not mean that mission activities need to be dismissed. Needs do not change or decrease. In fact, there are some needs that increase. One example would be blood donations. The need increases due to lower donations because people are out of town, with kids at summer events and the list goes on. This is one of the reasons that the American Red Cross depends on the blood drive to be held on July 25th. We have 32 appointments available between 9:00 AM and 1:30 PM. If you have not ever given before, consider giving during this event. If you are at least 16 you can donate (16 year olds need written parental permission), meet weight and height requirements and are in general good health, you meet the requirements for donation. You must have a photo ID or Red Cross Blood Donor card. The process will take approximately an hour for the check in, medical history, donation and time spent at snack table afterward. You can give every 56 days (or 112 days with double red cell donation). Why give with the American Red Cross? Blood from Red Cross donations will be used at a location where it is most needed, which may be locally or your blood may be a perfect match for someone in a regional hospital in an extended area. Consider the value of this if you or a loved one are transferred from a local hospital to a larger hospital in the Raleigh, Durham or Chapel Hill area. Blood donated through American Red Cross would be available to them. Sign up to donate or let me know and I will put you on the schedule to donate the gift of life. In addition to donors, there will be a need for helpers during the event.

Wanda Jackson and I would like to say a BIG THANK YOU to everyone who assisted with any of the Relay for Life fundraisers. We had \$4800 donated this year to help fight cancer. Thanks to everyone who was involved in any way.

Mark your calendar for September 12, which is the date of the annual Parade of Tables. More details will follow, but make sure you plan to attend. This event for women and young ladies of the church and area has been greatly attended and a wonderful way to provide finances for a needed mission.

Look for details in coming weeks about a women's rally event that will be churchwide for all women that you will NOT want to miss. (Date to be determined.)

If you have not been attending a WMU or BYW meeting but would be interested in attending a monthly meeting please contact Annette. I am interested in hearing why some women are not attending or if there is something you would like to see available from the WMU.
