“The Secret to Overcoming Mountains”

What do you desire to see happen in your family? What about in our church? or within our community? or even within your own life? Most of us long to see something new and exciting taking place. Maybe a new corporation with new jobs; maybe a spiritual renewal; or a personal accomplishment; or maybe just a new attitude. Whatever we desire, it requires a starting point.

Then he said to me, “This is what the Lord says to Zerubbabel: It is not by force nor by strength, but by my Spirit, says the Lord of Heaven’s Armies. Zech. 4 NLT
